## Press Release

Ref: Death Investigation at 301 Baumgardner Road on February 16, 2010.

On February 16, 2010 at 0950hrs, the Glynn/Brunswick Joint Public Safety Communications Center received a wireless 911 call. The caller, who identified herself as Julia C. Murray (21 years of age), asked for an ambulance because she had "drowned" her two children, age 2 and age 4. She told the caller taker her address was 301 Baumgardner Rd. While on the phone with the 911 call taker there was a moment of silence in which Julia Murray did not respond to questions, she then commented that she had just shot herself and to "hurry" with no further comments made.

A few minutes after the call was received a Glynn County Police Officer arrived on scene with a Glynn County Fire Department EMS squad arriving thereafter. The County Police Officer found Julia Murray in one room with a gunshot wound to the chest who was unresponsive, but breathing. The officer then found the two children in another room together. The two-year-old boy was found breathing. The four-year-old girl was not breathing. The Emergency Squad transported all three to the S.E. GA Health System Brunswick Hospital.

It was reported to me at 12:30pm that four-year-old Ansli Murray (girl) was pronounced no-longer with us upon arrival at the hospital and that Julia Murray passed away around this same time (12:30pm), and that two-year-old Creighton Murray (boy) was admitted to the hospital in stable condition.

A handgun was found at the scene near Julia Murray that belonged to the family and appears to be the weapon used.

The preliminary investigation shows the evidence at the crime scene is consistent with the statements made by Julia Murray on the 911 call as to what occurred. The investigation is continuing by the Criminal Investigation Division of the County Police.
